



## PARTICIPANT INFORMATION STATEMENT for WORKSHOP PARTICIPANTS

Developing teachers' ability to optimise female students' STEM-related academic achievement and career aspirations:  
A museum-based study of professional learning

### 1. What is the research study about?

You are invited to take part in this research study. The research study aims to understand how to best help develop teachers' ability to optimise female students' STEM-related academic achievement and career aspirations. You have been invited because you are a preservice or practicing teacher in attendance at CONASTA 2018.

### 2. Who is conducting this research?

The study is being carried out by Dr Tracy Durksen and Scientia Professor Andrew Martin in collaboration with Derek Williamson of the Museum of Human Disease at UNSW Sydney. Our project officer is Dr Marianne Mansour from the School of Education at UNSW.

**Research Funder:** This research is being funded by the UNSW Collaborative Research Scheme through the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences.

### 3. Inclusion/Exclusion Criteria

Before you decide to participate in this research study, we need to ensure that it is ok for you to take part. The research study is looking to recruit people who meet the following criteria:

- A preservice or practicing teacher
- A teacher who is attending CONASTA 2018

### 4. Do I have to take part in this research study?

Participation in any research study is voluntary. If you do not want to take part, you do not have to. There will be a number of opportunities for you to consent (or withdraw consent) to participate.

If you decide you want to take part in the research study, you will be asked to:

- Read the information carefully (ask questions if necessary);
- Complete a 10-minute survey on an iPad or your own device while at CONASTA 2018
- At the end of the survey, you will be asked if you are interested in participating further in the research (we will only contact you with more information on additional participation opportunities if you provide your contact details).

### 5. What does participation in this research require, and are there any risks involved?

If you decide to take part in the research study, we will ask you to complete one 10-minute survey via Survey Monkey. The survey will ask you questions about you and your teaching and your professional development. We don't expect any aspect of this research process to cause any harm or discomfort, however if you experience feelings of distress as a result of participation in this study you can let the research team know and they will provide you with assistance. You also have the option of discontinuing the study tasks either temporarily or permanently.

### 6. What are the possible benefits to participation?

We hope to use the information gathered during this research study to benefit you as you think and reflect on your STEM experience as a teacher, your professional development as a teacher, and the way in which your professional learning can optimise female students' STEM-related academic achievement and career aspirations.

### 7. What will happen to information about me?

Submission of your responses to the survey is an indication of your consent. By clicking the 'I agree to participate' button you are providing your permission for the research team to collect and use



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information about you for the research study. Your data will be kept for a period of 7 years after the project's completion. We will store information about you in a non-identifiable format at UNSW Sydney on a password accessed computer in Room 131 John Goodsell. We will remove and store any identifiable details in a separate password protected document in the Chief Investigator's office. Your de-identified information will only be used for the purposes of this research and the related overarching project. Your information will only be used for the purposes explained in this information statement. Researchers at UNSW are required to store their any aggregated data in the UNSW data repository, this is a system called ResData. Once the aggregated data is deposited into this repository it will be retained in this system permanently. It will however be retained in a format where your identity will not be known.

### 8. How and when will I find out what the results of the research study are?

The research team intend to publish and/ report the results of the research study in a variety of ways. All information published will be done in a way that will not identify you. We would only use your details to send you the results of the research.

### 9. What if I want to withdraw from the research study?

If you do consent to participate, you may withdraw at any time. You can do so by completing the 'Withdrawal of Consent Form' which is provided at the end of this document. Alternatively you can ring the research team and tell them you no longer want to participate. If you decide to leave the research study, the researchers will destroy any information that has already been collected and no additional information will be collected from you. Your decision not to participate or to withdraw from the study, will not affect your relationship with UNSW Sydney. The information you provide is personal information for the purposes of the *Privacy and Personal Information Protection Act 1998* (NSW). You have the right of access to personal information held about you by the University, the right to request correction and amendment of it, and the right to make a complaint about a breach of the Information Protection Principles as contained in the PPIP Act. Further information on how the University protects personal information is available in the **UNSW Privacy Management Plan**.
