

Developing teachers' ability to optimise female students' STEM-related academic achievement and career aspirations:

A museum-based study of professional learning

1. What is the research study about?

You are invited to take part in this research study. The research study aims to understand how to best help develop Science and PDHPE teachers' ability to optimise female students' academic achievement and career aspirations. You have been invited because you are a teacher who has registered for one of the 2018 programs at the Museum of Human Disease.

2. Who is conducting this research?

The study is being carried out Dr Tracy Durksen and Scientia Professor Andrew Martin in collaboration with Derek Williamson of the Museum of Human Disease. Our project officer is Dr Marianne Mansour from the School of Education at UNSW Sydney.

Research Funder: This research is being funded by the UNSW Collaborative Research Scheme through the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences.

3. Inclusion/Exclusion Criteria

Before you decide to participate in this research study, we need to ensure that it is ok for you to take part. The research study is looking recruit people who meet the following criteria:

- A current teacher
- A teacher who has registered for one of the 2018 programs at the Museum of Human Disease

4. Do I have to take part in this research study?

Participation in any research study is voluntary. If you do not want to take part, you do not have to. There will be a number of opportunities for you to consent (or withdraw consent) to participate.

If you decide you want to take part in the research study, you will be asked to:

- Read the information carefully (ask questions if necessary);
- Complete a pre- and post-program online questionnaire;

In addition, there will be further opportunities for you to participate:

 At the end of the pre-program online questionnaire, you will be asked if you are interested in participating further in the research via an interview (to be completed in-person or by phone); and/or by having one of your Science or PDHPE lessons observed.

5. What does participation in this research require, and are there any risks involved?

If you decide to take part in the research study, we will firstly ask you to complete online pre- and post-program questionnaires via Survey Monkey. The questionnaires will ask you questions about you and your teaching, the program, and your professional development. Each questionnaire should take approximately 10-15 minutes to complete. If you choose to also participant via interviews (pre- and/or post), this would take approximately 30-45 minutes of your time before and after your workshop experience. This semi-structured interview will be an opportunity for you to further elaborate on your teaching, the program, and professional development.

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If you choose to also participate further by having one lesson observed and recorded, we would ask to be in your classroom for 20-50 minutes.

We don't expect any aspect of this research process to cause any harm or discomfort, however if you experience feelings of distress as a result of participation in this study you can let the research team know and they will provide you with assistance. You also have the option of discontinuing the study tasks either temporarily or permanently.

6. What are the possible benefits to participation?

We hope to use the information gathered during this research study to benefit you as you think and reflect on your STEM experience as a teacher, your professional development as a teacher, and the way in which your professional learning can optimise female students' academic achievement and career aspirations.

7. What will happen to information about me?

Submission of your responses to the online questionnaire is an indication of your consent. By clicking the 'I agree to participate' button you are providing your permission for the research team to collect and use information about you for the research study.

By signing separate consent forms for the semi-structured interview and the science lesson videorecording (see attached), you would consent to the research team collecting and using that information about you for the purposes of this research study.

Your data will be kept for a period of 7 years after the project's completion. We will store information about you in a non-identifiable format at UNSW Sydney on a password accessed computer in Room 131 John Goodsell. We will remove and store any identifiable details in a separate password protected document in the Chief Investigator's office. Your de-identified information will only be used for the purposes of this research and the related overarching project.

Your information will only be used for the purposes explained in this information statement. Researchers at UNSW are required to store their any aggregated data in the UNSW data repository, this is a system called ResData. Once the aggregated data is deposited into this repository it will be retained in this system permanently. It will however be retained in a format where your identity will not be known.

8. How and when will I find out what the results of the research study are?

The research team intend to publish and/ report the results of the research study in a variety of ways. All information published will be done in a way that will not identify you. 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9. What if I want to withdraw from the research study?

Your decision not to participate or to withdraw from the study, will not affect your relationship with UNSW Sydney.
